		<b>COUNTY OF SUSSEX</b>
		Until 1832 the two Knights of the Shire for Sussex were always elected for the whole county, but for many years there was an understanding between candidates that they should stand for either its East or its West part. The voting qualification at County elections was assessment to the Land Tax. From 1832 there were four Members for Sussex, two for the East and two for the West Division. The voting qualification was also changed. See also "Election Posters" below.

		The Hon. C.W. Wyndham stood for West Sussex, and Col. Warden Sergison and John Fuller, Esq., for East Sussex. Sergison lost at the poll and his petition to the House of Commons against the result of the election was unsuccessful. T.C. Medwin was Sergison's Horsham area agent and, with Samuel Waller of Arundel, the principal agent for settling the election accounts.
