

The Edith Harms Collection

Edith Margaret Harms (1870-1943) was born in Horsham, one of six children to Thomas, a plumber and painter, and Ellen Harms. The family lived at Richmond Terrace, Carfax, Horsham. Edith later became a teacher of drawing at the Horsham School of Art. She has exhibited in Paris and often with the Royal Institute of Painters in Watercolour in London.
